



Overall Goal: Increase safe bicycle use

- 1. Refine & expand the existing bicycle route network
- 2. Ensure plentiful, high-quality bicycle parking
- 3. Expand bicycle access to transit & bridges
- 4. Educate the public about bicycle safety

- 5. Improve bicycle safety through targeted enforcement
- 6. Promote & encourage safe bicycling
- 7. Adopt bicycle-friendly practices & policies
- 8. Prioritize & increase bicycle funding

- Identified strategies such as:
  - Pilot project of bicycles on light rail vehicles
  - Removal of auto parking to provide for onstreet bicycle parking, in coordination with community and stakeholder involvement







- Other strategies include:
  - Colored bicycle lanes
  - Bicycle sharing program



## **Funding Overview**

- Program has existing funds from grants, prior to injunction
- Timely use of funds is a factor for prioritization of implementation
- 1st year (FY 09/10): \$2.7 million of projects identified
  - 20% could be funded thru 09/10 Prop K
  - 80% identified through other available grants
- 2nd year (FY 10/11): \$6 million of projects identified
  - 50% could be funded thru Prop K
- Total bike project roll-out could be \$14 million
  - 30% could be funded thru Prop K
- Shortfall and new funds need to be identified to complete plan objectives

## **Funding Sources**


#### **Fund Sources Available While Injunction is in Place:**

- Prop K Sales Tax Dollars
- Transportation Development Act Funds (TDA)

#### **Fund Sources Primarily Available After Injunction is Lifted:**

- Bicycle Transportation Account (BTA)
- Safe Routes to Transit (SR2T)
- Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA)
- Regional Bicycle and Pedestrian Program (RBPP)
- Additional Federal Funding




- 60 near-term projects in the Bicycle Plan
  - 1 Project Requires No Legislation
  - 5 Projects Implemented
  - 9 Projects Will Be Legislated, Post-Injunction
  - 45 Projects Proposed To Be Legislated
- "Sharrow" installation
- Bicycle parking installation
- Signage Installation
