- Goal is to increase transit first mode share above 50% to increase walking
 - Pedestrian project (e.g. road diet)
 - Pedestrian safety
 - Integrated enforcement and education
 - School transportation policies and TDM
 - Pedestrian Planning Initiatives
 - Local and regional
 - Needs and opportunities
 - Increase capacity for growth and share information
 - Streamline integration of pedestrian needs and amenities into all projects so it becomes business as usual

 - Funding overview
 - ~\$23M/yr (Prop K=\$11M)
 - Primarily for capital
 - Deficiency for pedestrian safety from regional discretionary funds
 - Prop AA
 - \$10 annual vehicle registration fee increase for transportation project
 - \$5M/yr
 - 25% for pedestrian safety, 25% transit, 50% street (note, transit and street projects have ped safety elements)
