## BRIEF DESCRIPTION:

Discussion of the Operating Budget for FY 2013 and FY 2014 and public hearing regarding possible changes to various fares, fees, fines, rates and charges summarized in Exhibits 1-4 which are included in the Baseline Operating Budget for FY 2013 and FY 2014, and Appendix A which summarizes additional possible revenue sources for the SFMTA Board to consider.

## SUMMARY:

- Charter section 8A. 106 provides that the SFMTA must submit a two year budget by May 1 of each even-numbered year.
- On February 21, 2012 the SFMTA Board of Directors reviewed the Projected Budget for FY 2013 and FY 2014 that included a $\$ 19.6$ million deficit for FY 2013 and a $\$ 33.6$ million deficit for FY 2014 based on projections as of mid-February 2012. These figures are not cumulative.
- Changes to fares, fees, fine, rates and charges, summarized in Exhibits 1-3, are included in the Baseline Operating Budget for FY 2013 and FY 2014.
- Exhibit 4 includes administrative clean-up legislation for existing citations by eliminating tiered fines which the SFMTA is not able to enforce.
- Appendix A summarizes some of the additional possible revenue sources which were not included in the FY 2013 and FY 2014 Baseline Operating Budget presented to the SFMTA Board on February 21, 2012.
- Pursuant to Charter Section 16.112 and the Rules of Order of the Board of Directors, advertisements were placed in the City's official newspaper for a five-day period beginning on February 15, 2012 provide notice that the Board of Directors will hold a public hearing on March 6, 2012, to consider possible changes to fares, fees, fines, rates.
- A second public hearing will be held on April 3, 2012 and may include additional changes to these fares, fees, fines, rates and charges.
- The FY 2013 and FY 2104 Operating Budget is scheduled for approval by the SFMTA Board of Directors on April 17, 2012.

## PURPOSE

Presentation and discussion of the Operating Budget for FY 2013 and FY 2014 and public hearing regarding possible changes to various fares, fees, fines, rates and charges as summarized in Exhibits 1-4, and Appendix A which summarizes additional possible revenue sources for the SFMTA Board to consider.

## GOAL

Approval of the proposed resolution will support:

- Goal 3 of the SFMTA's Strategic Plan, External Affairs/Community Relations, which is to improve the customer experience, community value and enhance the image of the SFMTA and
- Goal 4 of the SFMTA's Strategic Plan, Financial Capacity, which is to ensure financial stability and effective resource allocation.


## DESCRIPTION

The SFMTA is preparing a two-year balanced Operating Budget for FY 2013 and FY 2014 for submittal by May 1, 2012 as required by Charter section 8A.106. On February 21, 2012 the SFMTA Board of Directors reviewed the Projected Budget for FY 2013 and FY 2014 that included a $\$ 19.6$ million deficit for FY 2013 and a $\$ 33.6$ million deficit for FY 2014 based on projections as of mid-February 2012. Solutions to balance the operating budget in the first year would carryover and resolve the second year deficit.

The Projected Operating Budget for FY 2013 and FY 2014 as presented to the SFMTA Board of Directors on February 21, 2012 based on projections as of mid-February 2012 is outlined in the tables below:

Pursuant to Charter Section 16.112 and the Rules of Order of the Board of Directors, advertisements were placed in the City's official newspaper to provide notice that the Board of Directors will hold a public hearing on March 6, 2012, to consider possible changes to fares, fees, fines, rates and charges. The Board's Rules of Order require that the advertisement run for at least five days and not less than fifteen days prior to the public hearings. In compliance with this requirement, the advertisement ran in the San Francisco Chronicle for a five-day period beginning on February 15, 2012.

## ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED

The SFMTA Board considered various options at the February 21, 2012 Board meeting including those summarized in Exhibits 1-3 which are part of the FY 2013 and FY 2014 Baseline Budget. Appendix A summarizes additional possible revenue options to balance the Operating Budget for FY 2013 and FY 2014. As the Operating Budget must be balanced, service reductions through a declaration of a fiscal emergency may also be potentially considered if the budget deficits are unable to be addressed through revenue measures and additional expenditure reductions.

## OTHER APPROVALS RECEIVED OR STILL REQUIRED

The SFMTA Board must approve a balanced Operating Budget for FY 2013 and FY2014 for submittal to the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors by May 1, 2012. The Planning Department must provide environmental clearance to the final changes to fines, fares, fees and charges.

The City Attorney has reviewed this calendar item.

## RECOMMENDATION

No action will be taken at this meeting. Based on the Board's discussion and public comment, staff will return to the Board with a balanced budget for consideration on April 3, 2012.

## EXHIBIT 2

## Cost Recovery Fees

All fees in this exhibit are calculated based cost recovery methodology for SFMTA costs except for fees associated with automobile towing and storage which, in addition to SFMTA cost recovery fees, include the towing and storage fees charge by the SFMTA's towing contractor.

Neighborhood Parking Permit Program (including Residential, Visitor, Business and Commercial, and Contractor Parking Permit Fees):

The Neighborhood Parking Program was established in 1976 to provide greater parking availability for City residents and merchants by discouraging long-term parking by nonresidents or commuters. Presently there are 27 residential parking permit areas in the City. The current fee for a standard annual permit is at $\$ 100.00$. These parking permit fees are a cost recovery fee and proposed increases will offset the actual costs for enforcement and other expenses associated with the administration of the Neighborhood Parking Program. The SFMTA is proposing to increase the fees for residential and contractor permits for FY 2013 and FY 2014 as described below.

## Color Curb Program:

Residents, organizations, and business owners apply for various colored curb parking designations as authorized by the California Vehicle Code. These zones include white zones (passenger loading and unloading), green zones (10-minute parking), red zones (no parking), and yellow zones (freight loading and unloading). The program's costs are funded by fees charged to the requestors. Yellow zones have historically not had a fee associated with them. Yellow zones are often initiated by Parking and Traffic to reduce double parking which may delay Muni buses and LRV trains. The yellow zones generally serve the entire block and not a specific business. Some taxi and tour bus zones are assessed white zone fees when the zone serves a hotel or identifiable commercial entity or beneficiary

## Temporary Street Closure:

A temporary street closure permit is required for events such as neighborhood block parties, street fairs, athletic or other events. The fee schedule imposes greater increases for late filed applications.

Special Traffic Permits: A Special Traffic Permit is required for any work that obstructs traffic on any street or sidewalk area due to construction, excavation, or other activity. A contractor must apply for a permit at least two business days prior to commencing work. The current permit fee is $\$ 176$ for processing and $\$ 36$ per day for the duration of the project. To address situations when permit applications are submitted with less than two business days prior to the work, a late fee of $\$ 201$ is currently assessed. The proposed increase in the special traffic permit fees are estimated to offset the cost of enforcement and other expenses associated with the administration of the program.

## Project 20 Processing Fee:

Project 20 is a program established by the San Francisco courts and, under agreement with the SFMTA, it provides options for eligible customers to work off parking fines by performing either community service or participating in a payment plan arranged through Project 20.The processing fee charged by the SFMTA covers the administrative costs of processing the contract with the customer, referral to the Project 20 office, and the processing/reconciliation of funds and work credits collected by Project 20 for parking citations.

## Boot Removal Fee:

A fee to remove a boot from a vehicle which is placed on a vehicle with five or more citations. The proposed increase in the boot removal fee is estimated to generate an additional $\$ 100,000$ for FY 2011 and $\$ 125,000$ for FY2012 to offset the cost of enforcement and other expenses associated with the administration of the program.
