## SAN FRANCISCO TAXI COMMISSION CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO

#### COMPLAINT

1. Complaint is hereby made against Tu Lam, Medallion Holder # 896, A-card Permit Holder # P-44 # 48151, that said permit holder has conducted himself in a disorderly manner and violated provisions of the Municipal Police Code as described below.

2. In early 2007, the Taxi Commission and the San Francisco Police Department jointly conducted an investigation of Union Cab. Investigation revealed that Union Cab was guilty of exploiting drivers, committing multiple Rule and Municipal Police Code violations. Mr. Tu Lam and Mr. John Nguyen, two medallion holders, along with a Me Quong Truong ("Mr. Me") were the color scheme permit holders of record. A color scheme permit cannot issue unless at least one medallion holder applies for the permit. Municipal Police Code § 1125 ("any holder of a taxicab permit or a taxicab dispatch service permit under this Article may apply to the Taxi Commission for [a] taxicab color scheme permit pursuant to Section 1080 of this Article...")

3. Taxi Commission Staff brought a Complaint for revocation of the color scheme and dispatch permits. See Exhibit A. The Commission revoked the permits. See Exhibit B. Tu Lam and John Nguyen asked to be removed from the color scheme permit, but the Commission declined to remove them. See Exhibit C. Commission staff considered a complaint for revocation of the Mr. Lam's medallion for his involvement in the Union Cab situation, but before it could be heard, a settlement was drafted and signed by the Commission and Mssrs. Nguyen and Lam. See Exhibit D. The settlement clearly provides that the defendants shall pay a total of \$10,000 in a particular format. Paragraph 5 of the Settlement Agreement states as follows:

If [the defendants] miss a payment the case will placed before the Taxi Commission Hearing Officer or the Taxi Commission with a minimum of fifteen (15) calendar

days' notice and shall proceed as if this Settlement Agreement had not been entered into. Missing a payment is defined as failure to pay by the  $5^{th}$  of the month for the month in which payment is due.

The Commission declined to bring complaints for revocation against Mr. Lam's medallion at that time.

4. During interviews with Taxi Commission staff, Mr. Lam claimed to be an innocent third party with no knowledge of what was happening at Union Cab. The Taxi Commission and the SFPD did not find these statements credible. At a minimum, Mr. Lam allowed his medallion to be used to operate a business which exploited and defrauded dozens of innocent drivers. According to a "General Agreement of Authorization" signed by Mr. Lam, Mr. Nguyen, and Mr. Truong, which described the flow of financial benefits from Union Cab to the three partners, Mr. Lam shared in the ill-gotten gains. See Exhibit E. In Calendar Year 2005, according to tax returns which he provided to the Commission, Mr. Lam also worked at Monster Cable. See Exhibit F. He was still employed there until December 28, 2007. See Exhibit G (To Be Provided Before Hearing).

5. The <u>Union Cab</u> Case stopped these practices at Union Cab, and the settlement was crafted as a small step towards justice for the dozens of drivers who lost their life savings. Mr. Lam acted as a member of Union Cab's management and facilitated the very existence of an entity used to deprive individuals of their life savings. The Commission offered him a second chance to remain in the industry – but now, Mr. Lam has reneged on the very Settlement Agreement which was designed to bring closure for all parties. Specifically, Mr. Lam has missed the October 2008 payment, the November 2008 payment, and the December 2008 payment. Additionally, he bounced a check for the February 2008 payment, resulting in a \$50 charges to the City and County of San Francisco. See Exhibit H.

6. Mr. Lam received his permit on February 12, 1997 and almost immediately began committing violations. Exhibit I. He has failed the Proposition K Driving Requirement at least seven times: once in Calendar Year 1999, once in Calendar Year 2003, once in Calendar Year 2004,

1	once in Calendar Year 2005, once in Calendar Year 2006, in Calendar Year 2007, and it appears									
, 2	that he will also fail it in Calendar Year 2008. See Exhibits J, K, L, and M. He does not appear on									
3	the rosters or schedules for Town Taxi for Calendar Years 2007 or 2008, despite having joined									
4	Town Taxi as an "affiliate/long-term leasor/color scheme only" on June 26, 2007, and he has no									
5	waybills for Calendar Years 2007 or 2008. See Exhibit N. Nor can any waybills or schedules or									
6	proof of driving can be located for Calendar Years 2004 or 2005. Although Mr. Lam was at Union									
- 7	Cab during the first half of Calendar Year 2007, and may attempt to claim the records were lost or									
8	stolen, he could have still completed the driving requirement in the second half of the year, and it is									
9	the medallion holder's responsibility to keep his own records.									
10 11	7. Municipal Police Code § 1090(a) provides as follows:									
12	(a) Revocation for Cause. Any permit issued under this Article may be suspended or revoked by the [Taxi Commission] for good cause after a noticed hearing. "Good cause" hereunder shall include but shall not be limited to, the following									
13	(i) The permittee ceased to be a full-time driver									
14 15	(iv) The permittee or an agent of the permittee knowingly made false statements to or concealed information from the Taxi Commission, the Executive Director, or the Police Department									
16 17	(vi) The permittee has failed to satisfy any judgment for damages arising from unlawful or negligent operation under any permit issued under this Article.									
18 19	(ix) The permittee violated any applicable statute, ordinance, rule or regulation pertaining to the operation or licensing of the vehicles and services regulated by this Article									
20	Upon a showing of good cause, the [Taxi Commission] shall have discretion to									
21	suspend or revoke a permit as set forth above, except that a suspension and/or revocation shall be mandatory in the circumstances described in subparts (i) through									
22	(iv) above.									
23	8. Mr. Lam facilitated, through his ownership of the Union Cab color scheme and his									
24	acquiescence in its business practices, the exploitation of dozens of drivers. Even when he was									
25	given a second chance by the Taxi Commission in the Settlement Agreement, he failed to avail									
26	himself of the opportunity that was presented. Instead he continued to violate the rules and breached									
27	the Settlement Agreement.									
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	1 9. Mr. Lam is an egregious violator of the Proposition K Driving Requirement. He has failed
	<sup>2</sup> the Proposition K Driving Requirement six out of the past six years and seven times in the past
,	decade. This constitutes six separate violations of MPC § 1081(f). Pursuant to MPC § 1090, his
4	permit must be revoked. The Commission may also, pursuant to MPC § 1186, impose fines of at
4	least \$140/day for every day or \$30 for every hour that the "permit holder fails to drive short of the
e	applicable standard for compliance." Here, Mr. Lam may be fined at least \$168,000 (800 hours x
7	\$30/hr = \$24,000, times seven years) for the minimum seven years he has completely failed the
8	Proposition K Driving Requirement, while reaping the benefits of leasing his permit to hard-
9	working drivers who paid gates and lease charges so that Mr. Lam could realize a profit. In the
10	alternative, Mr. Lam can pay a portion of the fine, and/or release his permit.
11	
. 12	10. For all of the above-listed conduct, Mr. Lam has violated, at a minimum, following rules:
- 13	Rules 4.A.1, 4.A.2, 4.A.3, 4.A.4, MPC § 1081(f), and MPC § 1138. These violations carry
14	minimum fines of \$25, \$250, \$25, and \$75 respectively.
15	
16	11. The Commission herby incorporates all violations listed in the original <u>Union Cab</u> complaint
17	as to Mr. Lam, the color scheme permit holder for Union Cab, including: Rules 5.A.1, 5.A.3, 5.A.4,
18	5.C.5, 5.E.1.c, 5.H.3, 5.H.3, 5.H.4, 5.H.6, 5.H.9, 5.H.15, 5.H.16, 5.H.17, 5.I.2, 5.I.3, 5.K.3, 5.C.2,
19	MPC §§ 1123, 1140(a), 1147.4, and 1148.6(b). The <u>Union Cab</u> complaint asked for fines of at least
20	\$65,955.88.
21	
22	12. The Commission reserves the right to amend this Complaint and introduce additional
23	evidence prior to or during the hearing as it becomes available.
24	
25	13. This Complaint shall constitute the Executive Director's Notice pursuant to MPC § 1188.
26	This Complaint shall be heard at the Taxi Commission on January 13, 2009 at 6:30 PM in Room
27	400 of City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, San Francisco, CA, 94102.

### SECOND AMENDED COMPLAINT

#### State of California City and County of San Francisco

Complaint is hereby made against: Union Cab, Inc., (aka "Union Cab") 1620 Davidson Avenue, San Francisco, CA 94124, that said company has conducted itself in a disorderly mainler and violated numerous provisions of the Municipal Police Code and Taxi Commission Taxicab/Ramped Taxi Rules and Regulations as follows:

#### Statement of Facts: Complaints and Investigation Timeline

The Taxi Commission began to receive a number of complaints beginning in August 2006 regarding Union Cab's business practices. Most of these complaints centered around disorderly premises and unsafe working conditions, as well as overcharging of gates and failure to provide receipts. Additionally, there were allegations that Union Cab had failed to provide liability and worker's compensation insurance. For these reasons, the Taxi Commission decided to investigate Union Cab.

On October 23, 2006, Lt. Jean Schlotz of the San Francisco Police Department (SFPD) Taxi Detail sent a letter to Executive Director Heidi Machen, requesting an investigation of Union Cab Company. (Letter from Lt. Schlotz to Director Machen, Attached.)

On February 13, 2007, the 2007 Public Convenience & Necessity (PC&N) Report was presented at the Commission. Union Cab had the worst performance of any dispatch company. Forty-six calls were placed to Union Cab and only two cabs actually arrived. The majority of the PC&N survey was conducted in late November and early December, with isolated dates in January as well. Union Cab reported on its semi-annual dispatch report of January 15, 2007 [improperly dated January 15, 2006] that only 8 calls were not assigned and 4 calls were assigned but not picked up. However, more than 12 "no-shows" or "no-cabs" were noted for Union Cab during November and December — even assuming that all 12 occurred at the precise time of the PC&N Survey. Therefore, it can be inferred that Union Cab fraudulently reported dispatch data on its January 15, 2007 dispatch report. Staff also noted that Union Cab's semi-annual dispatch report of July 10, 2006 was "incorrect." (2006 Semi-Annual Dispatch Reports of Union Cab, Attached.)

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On February 27, 2007, Sgt. Ron Reynolds of the SFPD received a telephone call from Taxi Commissioner Richard Benjamin regarding criminal activity at Union Cab.

For these reasons, the Taxi Commission decided to investigate Union Cab Company.

#### March

On March 8, 2007, the Taxi Commission received a letter from Saam Aryan #9007, stating that his vehicle was badly damaged and parked at Union Cab's lot, and that he had been unable to locate Mr. Me to obtain information about his medallion. Mr. Aryan's letter indicated that the driver's roster for Union Cab stated that # 9037 was being used illegally in a Yellow Cab spare, # 2837. This roster also indicated a widespread practice of Union Cab medallions being used in Yellow Cab Spares, series # 2701-#2899 (March 8, 2007 Letter from Saam Aryan and attached Driver's Roster.)

On March 20, 2007, the Taxi Detail received information that Union Cab's liability insurance would be cancelled on March 27, 2007.

On March 22, 2007, Sgt. Reynolds received information that Union Cab ramp vehicle # 9052 did not have insurance. He was told that medallion # 9052 was being used in various spare taxicabs. He contacted the Ground Transportation Unit (GTU) of the San Francisco Airport and Dan Borg, Chief Mechanic of GTU, obtained the records on # 9052. Dan Borg showed that # 9052 has only been driven 2000 miles since September. On March 24, 2007, # 9052 was ordered to go to inspection.

Also on March 22, 2007, the Taxi Commission received information that Yellow Cab was storing and lispatching Yellow cabs out of Union's address. The cab numbers were: 215, 328, 408, 409, 514, 544, i53, 557, 594, 681, 693, 695, 710, 769, 871, 972, 1065, 1081, 1113, 1206, 1247, 1256 and 1281.

In March 27, 2007, Sgt. Ron Reynolds and Deputy Director Jordanna Thigpen went to Union Cab for he purpose of ascertaining whether or not Union Cab had liability insurance. Union Cab provided a ertificate indicating that its liability insurance had been reinstated as of the very day that Sgt. Reynolds nd Deputy Director Thigpen were present at Union. Sgt. Reynolds and Deputy Director Thigpen iterviewed Mr. Me Quang Truong (Mr. Me) and asked him about his insurance coverage and other latters. Mr. Me admitted he did not have worker's compensation and had not had it since April 2006. He ated that he had been in negotiations as recently as the week before with Y.A. Tittle insurance brokers obtain worker's compensation coverage. He asked for one more week in order to obtain worker's impensation coverage to comply with existing rules and regulations.

gt. Reynolds and Deputy Director Thigpen also asked Mr. Me for his driver's rosters, signature roster of mittees (medallion holders and drivers) acknowledging receipt of rules, and lease agreements with edallion holders. He was unable to provide any of these documents as he claimed that they were locked cabinets and he did not have the key because the secretary was ill.

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1 April 4, 2007, Mr. Me faxed a letter from Y.A. Tittle to the Taxi Commission. This letter was dated vember 16, 2006, and stated that Y.A. Tittle was looking into a worker's compensation quote at Mr.

#### Me's request.

On April 6, 2007, Taxi Commission staff returned to Union and conducted a routine audit of Union Cab's business premises. This audit was conducted on behalf of the Commission by Heidi Machen, Jordanna Thigpen, and Jack Brodnax. Multiple violations were discovered as detailed below. Most notably, # 1157 had a broken seal on its taximeter. Many vehicles had no radio dispatch capability, a serious safety and service concern.

Sgt. Reynolds and Deputy Director Thigpen returned to Union Cab on April 17, 2007. Mr. Me still did not have worker's compensation insurance. He invited Deputy Director Thigpen to call Y.A. Tittle, which she did on her cellular phone. The broker at Y.A. Tittle, Paul Batmale, indicated that he had not had discussions with Mr. Me regarding worker's compensation in "months" and had not obtained a policy of worker's compensation for Mr. Me. At the April 17, 2007, Mr. Me produced what he claimed were leases with each of the medallion holders affiliated with his company. In those leases, Union Cab explicitly agreed to provide worker's compensation and liability insurance.

Mr. Me indicated during this meeting that if he did not sell his house, he would be bankrupt and that he owed \$180,000-\$200,000 in various debts. He stated that he considered Nate Dwiri his father and he stated that he had no other type of relationship with Yellow Cab, whether financial or otherwise.

On each occasion that Taxi Commission and SFPD staff visited Union Cab, they noticed Yellow Cabs parked and/or shift-changing on Union Cab property. Additionally, Yellow Cab medallion holder and driver waybills were discovered filed *en masse* at Union Cab. Union Cab had provided a special area for Yellow Cab medallion holders and drivers to turn in their waybills.

Also on April 17, 2007, Florante Ascuncion # 211, a Yellow Cab medallion holder, came to the Taxi Detail and the Taxi Commission separately to complain about Union Cab in response to an admonishment he had received for shift-changing off of Yellow Cab's property. Asuncion stated that he had leased his medallion to Union Cab. He wanted to drive his own cab for his 800-hour requirement but Mr. Me refused to produce that vehicle and instead forced him to drive spares. According to Mr. Ascuncion, Union Cab has not paid him for his medallion since February 2007. he also produced a document showing that he had purchased "shares" in Union Cab, and he has not received dividends on that investment in accordance with the terms of the investment agreement. Mr. Me has given him two checks that have been returned for insufficient funds. (Declaration of Florante Ascuncion and February 14, 2006 Agreement between Ascuncion and Union Cab, attached.)

On April 20, 2007, a complaint came to the Taxi Detail alleging that Union Cab's spares did not meet safety requirements. On April 23, 2007, Mr. Me was ordered to pull his spare cabs from service and take them to GTU for inspection. (April 23, 2007 Letter from Sgt. Reynolds to Mr. Me.) On April 25, 2007 Officer Lily Ng of the Airport Police made a safety inspection of Union Cab # 1009. Officer Ng discovered that Vehicle # 1009 had no license plates, no brake lights, no registration tabs, and no proof of insurance. (April 25, 2007 Memorandum from Officer Ng to Lt. Schlotz.)

On April 23, 2007, the Taxi Commission served Union Cab with a Complaint listing specific violations and assessing a fine in the amount of \$58,505.88. The due date for payment of the fines was May 23, 2007. Upon request of Mr. Me, Taxi Commission staff is negotiating an extension on this due date. On April 26, 2007, Officer Molver of the Airport Police was conducted taxi enforcement at the Airport. He noticed Union Cab # 1157. This was the very same vehicle which had been ordered to undergo a Weights and Measures inspection for having a broken taximeter. # 1157 had no license plates. Officer Molver placed the vehicle out of service and cited the driver for having no commercial license plates and missing registration tabs. (Memorandum from Officer Molver to Lt. Schlotz)

Also on April 26, 2007, Officer Molver noticed # 1230 at the Airport. # 1230 had no license plates attached to the vehicle. Officer Molver placed # 1230 out of service and issued a citation to the driver for no license plates, no registration card in the vehicle, no registration tabs, and no temporary operating permit. (Memorandum from Officer Molver to Lt. Schlotz.)

On April 26, 2007, Sgt. Reynolds and Deputy Director Thigpen visited Union Cab once again to attempt to collect the missing documentation that Mr. Me had promised to locate. Upon arrival at the Union Cab premises, Sgt. Reynolds and Deputy Director Thigpen noticed that Union Cabs were parked outside the Union Cab premises in various states of disrepair. Upon entering the Union Cab premises, Sgt. Reynolds and Deputy Director Thigpen noticed that extension cords were being strung up everywhere in the garage and business office areas in an attempt to siphon electricity from surrounding businesses. Mr. Me stated that the utilities had been turned off. Sgt. Reynolds advised Mr. Me that stealing electricity from surrounding businesses was a criminal activity. Deputy Director Thigpen asked for the documentation previously requested and Mr. Me stated that his accountant no longer worked for him. Mr. Me stated that he might be able to find the documents in a trailer parked on the adjoining lot. When a search of the trailer failed to turn up the documents, Mr. Me stated that the documents must have been stolen.

Sgt. Reynolds inquired about the spares which had been ordered to be repaired. Mr. Me stated that they were all in the yard and had not been repaired because he had no mechanics left at his auto repair business.

On April 30, 2007, Deputy Director Thigpen met with Carlos Adriao. Mr. Adriao stated that he went to the Union Cab company over one year ago and leased Yellow Cab # 871 from Mr. Me. Mr. Me told Mr. Adriao that he would lease Yellow Cab # 871 to Mr. Adriao because "he [Mr. Me] was the manager of 1620 DFavidson Street and that it was a Yellow-licensed garage, he told me he managed the parking lot and all CNG cars from Yellow, working out of his lot." Declaration of Carlos Adriao.

Mr. Adriao stated that he paid a total of \$90,000 to Mr. Me. Mr. Adriao worked two to three shifts per veek and had other drivers working for him. He would charge approximately \$100 in gate fees per tenour shift and sometimes more. Mr. Adriao stated that medallion holder # 871, Farhad Golshan, never howed up for work in 2006 or 2007 and that he [Mr. Adriao] had exclusive use of # 871. Ultimately Mr. Adriao invested in two additional cabs, medallions # 710 and # 769, also affiliated with Yellow Cab. Mr. Adriao stated that he had paid \$90,000 for the three vehicles.

Ir. Adriao stated that on or about April 17, 2007, Yellow Cab stopped processing credit card payments nat Mr. Adriao and his drivers received for # 871, #710, and # 769. Yellow Cab's Nate Dwiri informed Ir. Adriao that the reason for the nonpayment was because Mr. Me owed Yellow Cab a lot of money. Ir. Adriao also stated that Mr. Golshan, the medallion holder of # 871, had offered him \$10,000 to drive is medallion and log into the Yellow Cab computer system using his [Mr. Golshan's] identification and

#### to falsify waybills.

Mr. Adriao produced receipts from May 5, 2006 to October 18, 2006 for \$59,483 in payments to Mr. Me for "purchase" of vehicles. He also produced (1) insurance certificates indicating that the registered owners of the Yellow Cab vehicles # 871 and # 710 was Union Cab and Clean Energy Financing and (2) contradictory certificates indicating that the registered owner was Yellow Cab.

On April 30, 2007, Deputy Director Thigpen also met with Farhad Golshan # 871. Mr. Golshan produced a copy of an agreement with "Wolley LLC, a subsidiary of Yellow Cab Cooperative, Inc" that he had entered into on April 1, 2006 for lease of his medallion # 871. Mr. Golshan stated that he had gone to Union Cab in 2006 and signed an agreement on May 1, 2006, that he believed was with Union. He stated that he "signed what they put in front of me, I trusted them." He first realized the problems with Union in December. He stated that Nate Dwiri charged him \$850/month for use of Yellow Cab vehicles and that now Yellow Cab was requesting \$3,000 per month since Mr. Me had stopped paying them.

#### May

On May 2, 2007, Deputy Director Thigpen and Sgt. Reynolds went to Union Cab. Upon arrival, they noticed several Union Cabs sitting outside on the dirt as well as various Union Cab medallion holders and drivers milling around the entrance. Union Cab's dispatch system was not working and no calls were coming through.

In particular, Union Cab # 1157 was sitting outside with its identifying numbers removed and with no license plates. Another vehicle was freshly painted with #1157's number and with the Union color scheme. The medallion holder, Mohamed Bathani, produced a document alleged to be an inspection report from GTU, approving the new vehicle. However, this inspection sheet stated that the vehicle was a gasoline vehicle, while the vehicle was in fact CNG. When questioned about this important discrepancy, Mr. Bathani stated that GTU must have made a mistake.

Sgt. Reynolds and Deputy Director Thigpen noticed that the lot which had formerly been occupied by Union and Yellow Cabs was locked and access from the Union Cab premises was cut off with patchwork sheets of metal. They went into the business office and noticed that the utilities had been turned back on. They asked for the driver's rosters from 2005 and 2006 and were informed the documents were in Mr. – Me's locked office and therefore unavailable.

On May 7, 2007, Deputy Director Thigpen interviewed drivers Iranne Rampur and Khaing Oo Nyo and Mr. Rampur's brother, Raja Rampur. They stated that they had paid Mr. Me large sums of money to purchase vehicles but that Mr. Me had taken their money under false pretenses. Mr. Nyo stated that Mr. Me had sold him a Yellow Cab vehicle and provided a copy of an agreement he had signed with Mr. Me. (Declarations of Iranne Rampus, Khaing Oo Nyo, and Raja Rampur, Attached.)

Also on May 7, 2007, Deputy Director Thigpen interviewed Salauddin Shaikh, a driver who had "purchased" a vehicle from Mr. Me. Mr. Shaikh had paid for one vehicle at Yellow Cab and stated that Pamela Martinez, manager of Yellow Cab, had run his credit card through Yellow Cab credit card machines for a total of \$20,000. He produced receipts documenting this transaction. (Declaration of Saluaddin Shaikh, Attached.)

On May 7-8, Sgt. Reynolds interviewed medallion holders Mike Dashti and Aboulghassem Malmirchegini. Both indicated that Union Cab's business practices were declining and noted other problems, including violations of the triple-layer lease rule. (Declarations of Mike Dashti and Aboulghassem Malmirchegini, Attached.)

On May 7, 2007, Deputy Director Thigpen audited the only driver's rosters for Union Cab that could be located – those from April 4, 2007 to April 26, 2007. These driver's rosters contained assignments for a mélange of Yellow and Union Cabs. For example, on April 4, 2007, two Union Cabs (#9052 and # 846) are assigned to drivers, but the remainder that were assigned (#484, # 520, # 691, and # 1113) are Yellow Cabs. ("Drivers Roster," April 4, 2007, Attached.) Additionally, a Yellow Driver Roster was included for April 22, 2007, assigning some of the Yellow Cabs which were noticed shift-changing on Union property. ("Yellow Driver Roster," April 22, 2007, Attached.)

On May 8, 2007, the Taxi Commission received a fax from medallion holder George Lancia, who indicated that Mr. Me had also defrauded him of money. (April 16, 2007 Letter from George Lancia to Mr. Me, Attached)

On May 11, 2007, Union Cab's liability insurance was renewed until October 2007.

On May 18, 2007, Deputy Director Thigpen met with Mohammed Asim Butt ("Asim") who stated that he had also given money to Mr. Me under false pretenses to "purchase" vehicles. (Declaration of Mohammed Asim Butt, Attached)

On May 18, 2007, Mr. Me called the Taxi Commission offices and orally requested an extension of time o pay his fines, which were due on May 23, 2007. He also sent a letter to the Taxi Commission with the ame date.( Letter from Mr. Me to Director Machen, Attached) Director Machen informed Mr. me that as request could be granted until June 11, 2007, but that he would have to sign an extension agreement. The Taxi Commission mailed an extension agreement to Mr. Me but he did not respond, and the Union Lab fine remained unpaid as of June 6, 2007, the date of this Second Amended Complaint. (Unsigned Extension Agreement, Attached)

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In June 5, 2007, Tu Lam and John Nguyen, who appear along with Mr. Me as the color scheme holders frecord, came to the Taxi Commission offices and met with Deputy Director Thigpen. They requested be removed from the Union color scheme permit. This request appears as a separate agenda item on a June 12, 2007 Commission agenda for a full factual hearing.

n June 6, 2007, Deputy Director Thigpen interviewed Kamaljit Singh, Ravinda Singh, Saeed Ahmad han, and Ashfaq Ahmad. All stated that they had been induced to "purchase" vehicles from Mr. Me der false pretenses and these vehicles had later been repossessed by either the medallion holders or the gistered owners. (Declarations of Kamaljit Singh, Saeed Ahmad Khan, and Ashfaq Ahmad, Attached.)

ndings

Based on the audit and the ongoing investigation of Union Cab, Union Cab Company was served with a Complaint dated April 23, 2007, and an Amended Complaint on May 14, 2007 that included the following offenses and fines:

#### Rule 5.A.1

Every Licensed Permit Holder shall comply with the provisions of the ... Police Code ... and these Taxicab Regulations.

Penalty: \$25 (for 27 rules violated for a total of \$675)

#### Rule 5.A.3

...Color Scheme Holders shall ensure that every taxicab operating under their color scheme contains a copy of these regulations...

Penalty: \$75 (for 19 cabs, none of which contain a copy of the regulations, for a total of \$1425)

#### Rule 5.A.4

All Color Scheme Holders and their employees shall ensure that the operation of their color scheme is in compliance with all the rules and regulations required of the Color Scheme Holder.

Penalty: \$25 (for 27 rules violated for a total of \$675)

#### Rule 5.H.2

The Color Scheme Holder shall post a current list of all taxicab vehicles at both their Primary Place of Business and where their vehicles are stored when not in service, (if different from their Primary Place of Business). Said list shall include, but not limited to, the taxicab vehicle number, the motor vehicle license number, the vehicle identification number, the year and make of the vehicle, and the operating status of each taxicab vehicle for which a permit is held. A copy of said list shall be available for inspection by any police officer engaged in the performance of their duty.

#### Penalty: \$75

Union Cab did not have this list, and was unable to provide information about the Yellow Cab vehicles stored on its lot.

#### Rule 5.H.3

A current roster shall be maintained at the principal place of business. It shall contain the following information: Driver's name, home address, home telephone number, "A" card number and California driver license number, of all permitted drivers who currently operate taxicab vehicles. A copy of said roster shall be available for inspection by any police officer engaged in the performance of their duty. The roster is to be made available twenty-four (24) hours a day and updated on a weekly basis.

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Penalty: \$75

Union Cab failed to provide this roster upon request.

#### Rule 5.H.4

Every Color Scheme Holder shall post a daily roster to include, but not limited to, the shift assignment, driver's name, vehicle number and/or medallion number, if different and the hours worked for that shift. This roster shall be updated on a daily basis and shall be made available for inspection by the Taxicab Commission or their designee. All original rosters shall be retained at the color scheme's place of business for a period of no less than six (6) years to document that driving performed by drivers of taxicabs and for a period of no less than six (6) years to document that driving requirements mandated by ramped taxis affiliated with the Color Schemes have met the specific driving requirements mandated by Section 1121(b). Color Schemes shall maintain at minimum the most recent twelve (12) months of rosters in a traditional hard-copy format. Color Schemes may store rosters more than twelve (12) months old in a reasonably secure electronic form and/or on a computer storage diskette.

Penalty: \$75

Jnion Cab had no record of prior rosters.

{ule 5.H.6

imploy a person, service or device having the capability of receiving inquiries about lost property on a wenty-four (24) hour basis.

#### 'enalty: \$75

lule 5.H.9

mploy a person or service having the capability of receiving requests for service and dispatching those equests in a timely fashion. All Medallion Holders affiliated within a Color Scheme must utilize the same ispatch service. The Color Scheme Holder must notify the Taxi Detail prior to changing their dispatch view.

enalty: \$75

uring the Public Convenience and Necessity hearing it was discovered that Union Cab was not employing spatchers capable of speaking English and communicating with passengers attempting to obtain service or formation. There were several violations of this rule, but the Commission will assess one violation.

ule 5.H.15

the first business day of each week, all Color Scheme Holders shall fax, to the Taxi Detail, the names all Drivers and Medallion Holders who have failed to turn in waybills during the previous week.

#### Penalty: \$25 and escalating

Union Cab has not been in compliance with this rule for at least one year, according to Officer Paul Mackaveckas of the SFPD Taxi Detail. The first offense is \$25, the second offense is \$50, and third and continuing offenses are \$150. Therefore, the fine should be \$7575.00 (50 weeks @ \$150, plus the first two weeks at \$75.)

#### Rule 5.H.16

The Color Scheme must have a copy of Certificate of Worker's Compensation Insurance prominently. displayed at the place of business so that it is visible to drivers.

Penalty: In prior cases this penalty has been assessed on a per-day basis. Here, Mr. Me admitted that he has not held worker's compensation since April 2006. Assuming May 1, 2006 is the starting point, the penalty would be \$75 for that day, \$150 for the next day, and \$450 thereafter. As of April 24, 2007, this would be a total of \$160,875.00 (357 days @ \$450 plus \$225 for the first two days). Tehenically this fine could be assessed for each of the 19 cabs in Union's fleet, for a total of \$3,056,625.00. Clearly, this would be excessive. Most taxi companies pay approximately \$500 for worker's compensation insurance per cab. Union Cab has 19 cabs in its fleet. That is a savings of \$9,500 per month, or nearly \$114,000, that Union obtained by competing unfairly and dangerously and refusing to provide worker's compensation. A penalty of \$50,000 does not seem unreasonable in this instance.

#### Rule 5.H.17

All Color Scheme Holders must post the amounts charged for gate fees in a prominent and public location. This posting must include the amount charged for each and all available shifts over the seven days of the week.

Penalty: \$75

#### **Rule 5.I.2**

If the [lost] property is currency, is of the value of one hundred dollars (\$100) or more, is either a serialized item or an electronic device or contains owners identification information, the Color Scheme Holder or the designee, shall within thirty (30) days, transfer the property to the Taxi Detail, make a Police Report, and obtain both Police Incident Report Number and a receipt of the items processed.

#### Penalty: \$75

See description below under Rule 5.I.3 violation.

#### Rule 5.1.3

Every Color Scheme Holder shall maintain a log book which records the date, time taxicab, driver incident report number, (if applicable), description and disposition of the property at the principal place

of business. The log book shall be retained for a minimum period of one year.

Penalty: \$75

During the audit, staff inquired about lost property and its storage. Mr. Me stated "There is no lost property." Deputy Director Thigpen saw a filing cabinet with the label "lost property" on the front. She asked Mr. Me to open it and he did so. It was filled with cellular telephones, electronic equipment such as Treos and Blackberrys, keys, and other personal items. Mr. Me stated "this is our lost property," directly contradicting what he had said moments before.

Union Cab's lost property logs all stated "no lost property" and only went back to January 1, 2007. There were no other records pertaining to lost property.

In April 23, 2007, at 3:30 PM, Deputy Director Thigpen placed a call to Union Cab's dispatch line, 285-1901, and stated that she had lost a cellular phone the night before. She was transferred to a female who tated "We have no cellular phones here, there are no cell phones here."

#### lule 5.K.3

III Color Scheme Holders shall issue receipts of payments for either gas, gates, leases or others fees when equested.

enalty: \$25

inion Cab has refused to provide receipts for gate charges to drivers.

#### Iedallion # 1157:

ule 5.C.2

he Taximeter installed in the taxicab vehicle must have a current and valid seal from the San Francisco City Ind County Department of Agriculture and Weights and Measures.

inalty: \$250

e audit revealed that the seal on Medallion #1157 was broken and was not current.

# unicipal Police Code § 1140(a)

e of Inaccurate Taximeters Prohibited. The use of any inaccurate taximeter or other measuring instrument the purpose of gauging or indicating distance traveled, or waiting time, or for the purpose of fixing rates be collected from the public, is hereby prohibited, and it shall be the duty of the owner or lessee in session of any motor vehicle for hire to which there is attached any taximeter or other measuring trument, to at all times keep said taximeter or other measuring instrument accurate.

1alty: \$113.97

#### Rule 5.C.3

Seats, upholstery and rugs shall match the vehicle's interior colors and must be kept in good repair. They must not be torn, separated or ripped...

Penalty: \$25

Medallion #1157 was filthy and degraded in the interior.

Rule 5.C.5

Rate cards must be displayed conspicuously in locations that are easily viewed by any passenger riding in the taxicab vehicle.

Penalty: \$25

Medallion #1157 did not have a rate card.

Rule 5.E.1.c

All Color Scheme Holders must comply with Section 1147.2 MPC by providing the following equipment...c. two way radios with direct voice access in an emergency.

Penalty: \$75

Medallion # 1157 did not have a working radio installed.

Municipal Police Code § 1123(a)

Radio Required. Commencing 60 days darter the effective date of this Article, it shall be unlawful for any taxicab licensed pursuant to this Article to be operated without a radio permitting two-way communication with a taxicab dispatch service licensed pursuant to this Article.

Penalty: \$113.97

Medallion # 1157 did not have a working radio installed.

Medallion #2484:

Rule 5.E.1.c

All Color Scheme Holders must comply with Section 1147.2 MPC by providing the following equipment...c. two way radios with direct voice access in an emergency.

Penalty: \$75

Spare # 2484 did not have a working radio installed.

## Municipal Police Code § 1123(a)

Radio Required. Commencing 60 days after the effective date of this Article, it shall be unlawful for any taxicab licensed pursuant to this Article to be operated without a radio permitting two-way communication with a taxicab dispatch service licensed pursuant to this Article.

Penalty: \$113.97

Spare # 2484 did not have a working radio installed.

Medallion # 680

Rule 5.E.1.c

All Color Scheme Holders must comply with Section 1147.2 MPC by providing the following equipment...c. two way radios with direct voice access in an emergency.

Penalty: \$75

Medallion # 680 did not have a working radio installed.

Municipal Police Code § 1123(a)

Radio Required. Commencing 60 days darter the effective date of this Article, it shall be unlawful for any axicab licensed pursuant to this Article to be operated without a radio permitting two-way communication with a taxicab dispatch service licensed pursuant to this Article.

'enalty: \$113.97

Acdallion # 680 did not have a working radio installed.

n addition, Union Cab has committed the following misdemeanors which indicate a pattern of rresponsibility in the industry:

funicipal Police Code (MPC) § 1135.1(b)(ii): Charging a gate fee over the cap, as evidenced by the hotograph of gate fees which were charged prior to a Taxi Commission inspection.

enalty: \$500

IPC § 1147.4:

ll persons, firms or corporations holding taxicab color scheme permits pursuant to Section 1125(b) of is Article shall comply with all applicable state statutes concerning Worker's Compensation and any applicable regulations adopted pursuant to those statutes. Taxicab color scheme permit holders must include a sworn statement attesting to compliance with such applicable statutes and regulations as part of the annual filing required by Section 1095 of this Article.

Penalty: \$500

MPC § 1148.6(b): improper use of a ramped taxi permit in a spare taxicab. Medallion # 9052 has been used in spares for months while the actual taxi #9052 has been sitting on the lot without repair. Ground Transportation Unit and Sgt Reynolds of SFPD Taxi Detail provided information that 9052 had driven less than 2000 miles between September 2006 and mid-March 2007 when normally taxis accumulate approximately 7000 miles per month.

#### Penalty: \$500

MPC § 1187.1: "(a) any person operating a motor vehicle as a taxicab or other motor vehicle for hire under this Article must have a permit as required in Section 1078." Union Cab operated spares using a temporary plastic medallion for 9052, while simultaneously operating the metal medallion of the same number in another spare vehicle, thus operating a vehicle as a taxicab without a (valid) medallion. Taxi Commission has a film of both vehicles shot on the same night around the same time operating at SFO with the same number of medallion.

Penalty: \$2500

Conclusion

MPC § 1090(a)(iv), (ix) provide as follows:

Any permit issued under this Article may be suspended or revoked by the Taxi Commission for good cause after a noticed hearing. "Good cause" hereunder shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following:

(iv) the permittee or an agent of the permittee knowingly made false statements to or concealed information from the Taxi Commission, the Chief of Police, or the Police Department;

(ix) the permittee violated any applicable statute, ordinance, rule, or regulation pertaining to the operation or licensing of the vehicles and services regulated by this Article, including any rules and regulations enacted by the Chief of Police pursuant to this Article.

Mr. Me has made repeated false statements to both Taxi Commission staff and Sgt. Reynolds of the Taxi Detail. Specifically, he stated that he did not have any relationship with Yellow Cab, whether financial or otherwise, beyond considering Nate Dwiri his "father." The facts and the testimony of drivers and medallion holders indicate otherwise. MPC § 1090(a) provides that revocation shall be mandatory under subpart (iv). The color scheme permit for Union Cab Inc. should be revoked for the reasons stated above.

MPC § 1090(b) states that "when a person violating this Article holds more than one permit to operate a

motor vehicle for hire in the City and County of San Francisco, the Taxi Commission may revoke or suspend all such permits." Union Cab also holds a dispatch permit and revocation of the dispatch permit is also requested under MPC § 1090(iv) and (ix).

A fact-finding hearing is scheduled for the regular Taxi Commission hearing on June 12, 2007 at 6:30 PM in Room 400 of San Francisco City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, San Francisco, CA 94102.

The Taxi Commission reserves the right to modify findings and present additional evidence as necessary up to and including the date of the hearing.

Dear Ms. Machen:

I am requesting that your department investigate further Union Cab Co.

In reviewing waybills for Eugene Shu who stated he drove medallion 1289 on 7/23/06 and 7/30/06; I interviewed Mr. Me the owner of Union Cab. He stated regarding Mr. Shu's waybills (1) They were good and Mr. Shu looked like a good medallion candidate, and (2) his taxi #1289 came in on 7-23-06 in the morning with a blown engine and was not used that day. Mr. Me checked with his manager, Victor, who said there was no roster for the day because the cab was totally out of service. (Mr. Me confirmed this).

Additional on cab #1289:

there was no check out booth or no garage spitter ticket for entrance at the airport for this cab, however there were 2 'drop offs' on the upper level at 6:19 am and 2:57 pm (drop offs do not have to go through the garage and pay, but it is unusual that they don't then go into the garage and wait for an 'available ride'if they are already at the airport). The license number listed at the airport is 7D09314. (2) GTU inspected 1289 for input into service as a new cab on 8/18/06, but Mr. Me said they put cab medallion 1289 back in service on Wednesday 7/26/06 as a new cab. There are also drop offs on 7-24-06 and 7-25-06 at the airport, which is before 7-26-06. (Therefore medallion 1289's use is questionable).

Finally, there has been no Workers Compensation State Fund coverage on this Cab Company since it cancelled on 4-24-06.

Commissioner Heinicke's request for some type of penalties, should be attached to this company for verifying false waybills of drivers (Mr. Shu)

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#### To whom it may concern,

My name is Carlos Adriao; I am 50 years old and have been a cab driver for past 5 year. My taxicab A-card number is P-44-056186. Approximately one year ag went to 1620 Davidson street in San Francisco, (a Yellow Cab leased parking lot.) I spoke with a man there named Mr. Me Quong Truong, "Mr. Me." Mr. Me told me that he was the manager of 1620 Davidson Street and that it was a Yellow licensed garage, he told me he managed the parking lot and all CNG cars from yellow, working out of his lot.

Mr. Me offered me the opportunity to lease a CNG cab from Yellow Cab Company, at this time Mr. Me was the only person leasing out CNG cabs and offered me one. I ultimately obtained Yellow Cab # 871, after I had Yellow 871 for a couple of months, Mr. Me offered to lease me Cab # 710, Fezz the medallion holder of # 710 was very helpful in purchasing the cab. He paid some of the car and drove it regularly filling out all his K-requirements. Mr. Me told me he was giving me the opportunity to lease out another cab because I was always making on time payments and keeping up with everything he had asked me to do. As time went by Mr. Me leased me Yellow Cab # 769.

Although I have paid Mr. Me a total of \$90,000 I have receipts for \$59,483. Which I was told was to buy the cars, insurance and to pay for the Yellow computer systems deposits, as follows.

On May 5, 2006 I paid Mr. Me \$7,800 for the gate lease of Yellow Cab # 871

• On June 2, 2006 I paid Mr. Me \$15,000 to " buy new cab # 910

• On July 28, 2006 I paid Mr. Me \$4,415

• On August 1, 2006 I paid Mr. Me \$1,000 for "gates only" on Yellow # 871

- Also on August 1, 2006 I paid Mr. Me \$938 for the August gate fees
- On August 10, 2006 I paid Mr. Me \$7,000 for a 2006 car
- Also on August 10, 2006 I paid Mr. Me \$3,000
- On August 23, 2006 I paid Mr. Me \$5,000 to "buy a new car"
- On October 4, 2006 I paid Mr. Me another \$8,830 to "pay in full" for vehicles number Yellow # 710 and Yellow # 871
- Also on October 4, 2006 I paid Mr. Me \$4,000 for a "new car"
- On October 18, 2006 I paid \$2,500 for vehicle Yellow # 769

I worked two to three shifts per week, when I wasn't working shifts I had other drivers working for me who would cover the rest of the weekly shifts. I managed a number of other drivers who all worked for other cab companies as well; I charged my cab drivers approximately \$100 in gate fees per day.

In the entire time I had cab number Yellow # 871 I never once saw the Medallion holder of Yellow cab # 871, Farhad Golshan, drive the cab in 2006 or 2007. I had exclusive control of the vehicle, which can be proved by checking the system log in on the computer in the cab. The last cab I obtained was cab # 769. I paid the car off in full ( the car its self, the insurance for the car and the deposit for the Yellow computer system.) I never once saw the medallion holder of Yellow cab # 769 drive the cab or anything else of that nature, until the past months when Yellow cut off all credit card receipts. At this time I came to find out that all my cars were leased but never paid even though I paid the cars off in full. When I approached Mr. Me to ask him about the situation he said he didn't know what was going on. He also gave me documents indicating that all my cars were registered to Yellow Cab company. After yellow stopped excepting my credit card receipts I went to the DMV to get the copies of the registration to my cabs and came to find out that both cabs # 710 and cab # 871 were registered to Union Cab company and not to Yellow Cab company who I had given all my money to, in order to pay for my cabs.

In March of 2007 medallion holder # 871 Farhand Golshan, came to me with a proposal. He proposed that I would give him a \$10,000 and pay him a monthly fee to lease his medallion. I would log in the cab computer system as him, so that it would make it look like he was complying with his obligations as a medallion holder ( K driving requirement). About two days after I turned down his proposal, I came to find out that the Yellow stripped the cab, they took the stickers out of the car and removed the computer from the car, without my consent and never paid me back for the deposit I invested into the cab.

Around April 17<sup>th</sup>, 2007 I went to Yellow Cab company, with the medallion holder for cab # 710, Fezz to speak with Nate Dwiri. I asked Nate to release the credit cards receipts so that my drivers and myself could collect the money from receipts from cab # 871, # 769 and cab # 710. Nate told me he wouldn't release the money for the receipts and I was out of luck. I told Nate I was going to the Taxicab Commission, he told me there was nothing the commission could do for my case, to this day I have not received any money for the credit card receipts from cab # 871. Nate would go to 1620 Davidson Street parking lot and meet with Mr. Me all the time, Nate would help manage the parking lot and would receive credit card receipts from Mr. Me, ( given to him by all the drivers). Nate would take the credit card receipts to yellow, and do who knows what with them. When I spoke with Nate at Yellow he said that he had nothing to do with Mr. Me and that 1620 Davidson Street was not a licensed Yellow parking lot, even though Nate would receive payments from Mr. Me and whenever one of the cabs would break down or need fixing Nate was right there to supply Mr. Me with spare cars and parts.

Around May  $5^{th}$ , 2007 the medallion holder for Cab # 769 fired my night driver, while I was in Brazil without my consent. Ali, the medallion holder, then told my day driver to pay him \$110 per day to work or he would be fired as well.

Nate told me that he has nothing to do with Mr. Me or with 1620 Davidson Street. However multiple long term leased Yellow cabs would park at 1620 Davidson Street and work out of the lot. Those cabs are as follows, Cab # 544, Cab # 409, Cab # 192, Cab # 512, Cab # 528, Cab #1176, Cab # 695 and even Cab # 541 which the medallion belongs to Yellow Cab company itself, and would work out from 1620 Davidson Street and would be paid to Mr. Me. In my opinion Yellow Cab company is responsible for all that went on. If Mr. Me wasn't part of Yellow he shouldn't have been receiving money to pay Yellow or leasing out cars under there name. How can Yellow not be responsible for anything that goes on at 1620 Davidson Street and claim to have no affiliation with Mr. Me but they loan him cars, give him parts and have the right to strip cab cars when they please, I don't see how that is possible if supposedly you have nothing to do with Mr. Me or his cars. I don't understand how Yellow can say they have no affiliation with Mr. Me when I along with other drivers would constantly see Mr. Me at Yellow with his mecanic Rudy, who now works for Yellow. I don't understand how someone who has nothing to do with Yellow was able to take over new cars and have them installed with Yellow Cab company computers and stickers to make the cars street ready.

I also don't see how Mr. Me was able to go months without paying rent on

multiple cars when Yellow wont let a cab driver work the next day if the driver is one dollar short. Mr. Me went months without paying none of his cars were stopped none of his drivers were stopped and now Yellow is going after drivers and telling them they are months past due and they have to pay Yellow or they will loose the lease to the medallions, cabs and jobs all together, money which was already paid to Mr. Me in order to pay Yellow. I also don't understand how Yellow can say they have nothing to do when in the process of shutting down Mr. Me Yellow handed out flyers at 1620 Davidson Street say that "until further notice cab drivers must use the Yellow Cab Co-op facility at 1200 Mississippi Street" how can they say have nothing to do with him when they obviously knew he was there and they knew what he was doing.

I believe Yellow Cab Company is at fault not only for mine but for the loss of multiple other drivers money. If Mr. Me was not part of Yellow Cab Company or protected by Yellow how could his parking lot have ran for so long, how could he have obtained all the necessary equipment to lease out Yellow cab cars, how can he have gone months without paying Yellow without any computers getting shut down, drivers shut down or even cars pulled off the streets? I just don't understand how something like this

was able to happen.

## **DECLARATION OF FARHAD GOLSHAN**

- 1. My name is Farhad Golshan and I am over age 18 and I am a citizen of the United States.
- 2. I hold medallion number #871, issued by the City and County of San Francisco.
- 3. On or about late 2005/early 2006 I went to Union Cab Company and spoke to the owner, Mr. Me Quong Truong ("Mr. Me"), for purposes of using the Union Cab color scheme for my Cab #871.
- 4. I signed an agreement on May 1, 2006, a copy of which is attached to this declaration. At the time I signed the agreement, I believed I was signing with Union Cab.
- 5. I was given the document by Nick Olson, who also signed it. I trusted Nick and the managers at Yellow Cab when they said I was signing with Union.
- 6. I also signed a piece of paper indicating that as a long term lease holder, I needed to shift change and file waybills at Yellow Cab's principal place of business.
- 7. Thereafter I noticed my cab was painted with Yellow colors.
- 8. I kept my cab at the Union Cab lot at 1620 Davidson Street.
- 9. Mr. Me started paying me for lease of my medallion in May 2006 when I signed.
- 10. I first realized Union Cab was having problems in December. Mr. Me stopped paying me in December 2006 and owes me for four months of the contract.

## **Color Scheme Affiliation Agreement**

This Agreement is entered into this <u>1</u>St day of <u>MAY</u>, 200<u>G</u> by and between Wolley, LLC ("Wolley, LLC"), a subsidiary of Yellow Cab Cooperative, Inc. ("YCC") and <u>FAICHAD</u> <u>GOL 5HAN</u>, the Operator ("Operator"). The Effective Date and Termination Date are as set forth on the front page of this Agreement.

WHEREAS, the parties acknowledge and understand that the San Francisco Municipal Police Code ("Police Code") as modified from time to time, and regulations promulgated thereunder (including "Taxicab Regulations" promulgated by the Office of the Chief of Police, San Francisco Police Department) prohibit any person from driving or otherwise operating a motor vehicle for hire on the public streets of San Francisco except in compliance with the Police Code; applicable regulations, and other applicable law; and

WHERBAS, Wolley, LLC is a subsidiary of YCC, a nonprofit cooperative of persons holding Vehicle for Hire Permits issued by the San Francisco Police Department, which Permits authorize the operation of motor vehicles for hire on the public streets of San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, YCC is authorized to operate a taxicab radio dispatch service in the City and County of San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, YCC possesses a taxicab color scheme approved by the San Francisco Chief of Police; and

WHEREAS, Operator maintains one or more vehicles appropriate to operate as a vehicle for hire pursuant to the Police Code and any and all implementing regulations, and desires to operate its vehicle pursuant to YCC's authorities described above and the terms of this Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agrees as follows:

### AGREEMENT

## A. WOLLEY, LLC AGREEMENTS and AUTHORIZATIONS.

1. Wolley, LLC authorizes Operator to operate under YCC's color scheme and Operator agrees to affiliate and to operate under YCC 's Color Scheme regarding the vehicles listed below in Schedule B ("Vehicle(s)"), and pursuant to the conditions set forth below. Wolley, LLC agrees to provide Operator, at its request and pursuant to the provisions set forth in Schedule D below, with such services as are required to paint, equip and mark the Vehicle(s) to comply with the rules and regulations governing the appearance of motor vehicles for hire, including but not limited to compliance with the YCC Color Scheme.

2. Wolley, LLC agrees to provide to Operator as part of this Affiliation Agreement, a communications link including taximeter, in good working order for each Vehicle operating under the YCC Color Scheme. The communications link will meet the requirements of the Police Code.

3. Wolley, LLC agrees to provide those Services/Options selected by Operator below on Schedule D on the terms and conditions set forth therein.

4. Wolley, LLC will provide, at no additional cost, a central location for such property, material or records that Operator is required to hold pursuant to Taxicab Regulations and other applicable provisions of law, including but not limited to lost and found items.

## **B. OPERATOR AGREEMENTS and REPRESENTATIONS.**

1. To the extent that Operator is also a driver, it represents and warrants that it is duly licensed, trained and authorized to operate a motor vehicle for hire pursuant to the Police Code, the Taxicab Regulations, applicable provisions of the Motor Vehicle Code and all other applicable provisions of law. A copy of the Police Code and applicable Taxicab Regulations, currently in effect are attached hereto as Appendix A. Operator further represents and warrants that all information supplied herein, and hereafter, regarding the subject matter of this Agreement is true and correct in all respects, and acknowledges further that the current and continued accuracy of such information is a material term and condition of this Agreement.

2. Operator agrees to supply its own Medallion(s) and Vehicle(s), as identified on the front page of this Agreement and/or in Schedule B, which Vehicle(s) shall be operated and maintained in all respects in compliance with the Police Code, the Taxicab Regulations, the Motor Vehicle Code, and all other applicable provisions of law. Operator acknowledges that Vehicle(s) must be of acceptable vintage, appearance and insurability, among other requirements, to comply with the Police Code.

3. Operator agrees to provide to Wolley, LLC sufficient identifying information regarding all persons operating the Vehicle(s) ("Drivers") to enable Wolley, LLC to discharge its obligations under the Police Code and implementing regulations. Operator agrees to maintain the currency of all such information and to notify Wolley, LLC promptly in the event there is a change in any of the information, either regarding Operator itself or any Drivers.

4. Operator will be responsible for and assure that all Drivers operating the Vehicle(s) under the YCC Color Scheme pursuant to this Agreement are properly licensed and trained and comply with all provisions of the Police Code, Taxicab Regulations and regulations relating to the operation of motor vehicles for hire. Operator will provide a copy of the Police Code and the Taxicab Regulations, then in effect to each Driver, and also assure that all Drivers comply with all rules and protocols contained in this Agreement or otherwise agreed to regarding the equipment leased and/or services purchased pursuant to this Agreement.

5. Operator agrees to maintain liability insurance coverage for each vehicle listed herein at a minimum meeting the requirements of the Police Code ("Insurance Policy"). Operator agrees to identify Wolley, LLC as an additional named insured under such Policy.

6. Operator agrees to maintain the Vehicle(s) in full compliance with all provisions of the Police Code, the Taxicab Regulations, and all other applicable rules and regulations relating to the maintenance of motor vehicles and motor vehicles for hire operating on the public streets of San Francisco.

7. Operator agrees to provide Wolley, LLC with such additional information, as may be reasonably requested by Wolley, LLC from time to time, in order to enable Wolley, LLC to meet its respective obligations under the Police Code, the Taxicab Regulations, and all other applicable provisions of law relating to the operation of motor vehicles for hire on the public streets of San Francisco. Such information specifically includes but is not limited to accurate and completed waybills, as required by Section 1138 of the Police Code, which waybills shall be submitted daily so that they are available for inspection as required.

8. Operator agrees to notify Wolley, LLC promptly, either directly or through its insurer, in the event of any accident involving a Vehicle(s). Such notice shall be in writing and shall indicate parties, drivers and vehicles involved, a statement of facts, a statement of personal injury and property damage, and witnesses, if any.

## C. FEES, COSTS AND OTHER CHARGES.

1. During the term of this Agreement, and except as otherwise provided herein, Operator shall pay to Wolley, LLC on or before the fifth day of each month the sum of \$750.00 for each vehicle listed on Schedule B and affiliated with the Wolley, LLC color scheme. This sum is subject to change by Wolley, LLC on thirty (30) days notice. The penalty for late payment of all due amounts shall be \$25 per day.

2. On or before the effective date of this Agreement, Operator shall pay to Wolley, LLC a security deposit in the amount of \$2,000.00 for each communications link (which includes a radio, meter and mobile data terminal) provided pursuant to this Agreement and any other charges accrued pursuant to this Agreement.

3.Operator agrees to pay all costs and other charges for any damage or repair to the communications link equipment installed in the Vehicle(s) pursuant to this Agreement, reasonable wear and tear excepted. 5. Operator agrees to pay to Wolley, LLC such additional amounts, monthly or as otherwise provided herein, for the optional Services/Options selected by Operator as set. These Services/Options are subject to change by Wolley, LLC on thirty (30) days notice.

4. In the event that Operator elects not to install the advertising equipment (comprising a rooftop, interior and deck sign), in one or more of the Vehicles listed on Schedule B, Wolley, LLC agrees to install a lighted bubble sign on such (a) Vehicle(s) in compliance with applicable law at a cost to Operator of \$100.00, due and payable on the effective date of this Agreement.

5. Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, each party shall be responsible for all costs and expenses incident to the performance of their obligations under this Agreement, including but not necessarily limited to all fees, fines, licenses, bonds, or taxes required or imposed against either party and all other costs of doing business for either party, including but not limited to damage to property or equipment, gasoline, motor oil and other maintenance charges.

6. All fees or costs charged pursuant to this Agreement are subject to change on thirty (30) days notice, or otherwise as specifically set forth herein.

## D. TERM -TERMINATION - RENEWAL

1. Unless notice is given 30 days prior to the expiration of this agreement by either party of their desire not to renew or to change any terms or conditions setforth herein, this Agreement will be automatically extended for an additional year.

2. Operator may terminate this Agreement on twenty-five (25) days notice if such notice is provided within five (5) days following notification of an increase in rate or fees to be charged under this Agreement.

3. Wolley, LLC may not otherwise terminate this Agreement except for "cause," in which event Wolley, LLC may terminate this Agreement at any time, with or without notice. For purposes of this Agreement, "cause" means any of the following: (a) violation by Operator (or any Driver) of any of the provisions applicable to Operator (or any Driver) of the Police Code, Taxicab Regulations, or any other provision of law applicable to the subject matter of this Agreement; (b) breach by Operator (or any Driver) of any material term of this Agreement. Solely by way of example, breach of this Agreement includes but is not limited to failure to pay timely any fee or charge due herein, failure to maintain appropriate insurance coverage on any Vehicle(s) or spare vehicle, abuse of or tampering with any equipment leased hereunder, or failure to assure that any person operating a Vehicle(s) or spare vehicle pursuant to this Agreement is properly licensed, trained and complied with all provisions of the police Code, Taxicab Regulations, and all other applicable rules and regulations.

4. On termination of this Agreement for any reason, Operator shall immediately return or otherwise arrange for the return of any and all leased taxicab Medallions and any equipment supplied by Wolley, LLC including but not limited to Vehicle(s) pursuant to this Agreement. Operator shall immediately cease, and shall assure that all Drivers immediately cease, operating any Vehicles under the YCC color scheme.

### E.

## ASSIGNMENT PROHIBITED

Operator agrees and understands that it may not assign this Agreement or any rights or obligations herein created without the express prior written consent of Wolley, LLC.

F.

### COOPERATION

Operator agrees to comply with all reasonable requests of Wolley, LLC reasonably necessary to Wolley, LLC to fully perform its duties under this Agreement and/or to fully comply with its duties and obligations under the Police Code, Taxicab Regulations, and all other applicable provisions of law related to the subject matter of this Agreement.

### NOTICES Ġ.

Any notices to be given hereunder by either Party to the other may be effected either by personal delivery in writing, or by mail, registered or certified, postage prepared with return receipt requested. Mailed notices shall be addressed to the Operator at the address appearing on the facing page of this Agreement and to Wolley, LLC at 1200 Mississippi Street, San Francisco, California 94107. Either party may change the address by written notice in accordance with this paragraph. Notices delivered personally will be

deemed communicated as of actual receipt; mailed notices will be deemed communicated as of two days after mailing.

### H. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement supersedes any and all agreements, either oral or written, between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter herein and contains all the covenants and agreements between the parties with respect to rendering services of any nature and in any manner whatsoever. Each party, including any Driver, acknowledges that no representations, inducements promises or agreements, orally or otherwise, have been made by any party, or anyone acting on behalf of any party, which are not embodied herein and that no other agreement, statement or promise not contained in this Agreement shall be valid or binding. Any modification of this Agreement is effective only if in writing and signed by the party to be charged.

### I. SEVERABILITY

d) Any award rendered by the arbitrator shall be final and judgment may be entered in accordance with applicable law and in any court having jurisdiction thereof. e) The existence and resolution of the arbitration will be kept confidential by the parties and by the arbitrator.

K. GOVERNING LAW.

This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.

## STATUS OF PARTIES

It is the express intention of the parties that they are lessor and lessor, or otherwise independent contractors, and not employees, agents, joint venturers or partners of each other. Nothing in this Agreement shall be interpreted or construed as creating or establishing the relationship of employer and employee between the parties or between Wolley, LLC and any employee or agent of Operator.

- 8. I took Yellow # 1118 home every day and my brother and I shared the driving. When we were not driving it we stored it at our houses. We never shift-changed on Yellow Cab property or Union Cab property.
- 9. On or about April 1, 2007, Mr. Me called me into the Union Cab office. I saw the medallion holder of Yellow # 1118, Philip Tran, for the first time. Mr. Tran stated that he was taking Yellow # 1118's medallion and for me to drop it off on April 2, 2007 at the Union Cab office. However, the next day when I returned with it, Mr. Me said I could continue to drive it.
- 10. Mr. Tran began driving the cab as of April 1, 2007. Now my brother, myself, and Mr. Tran share the vehicle. I drop the vehicle off at Mr. Tran's house for shift changes. We never shift change on Yellow Cab property and the Union Cab lot is now locked up.
- 11. On or about the beginning of May 2007 I received a call from Clean Energy Financing. They stated that they will re-possess the vehicle because no payments have ever been made on it. This is the vehicle that I was supposed to own and for which I paid \$29,000.
- 12. I have many outstanding credit card payments on Yellow Cab's account since the Yellow Cab computer system processes credit card payments. Yellow Cab froze the account on #1118 and I cannot get the money that is owed to my brother and I for credit card payments that we collected.
- 13. Mr. Me told me that I could not go to Yellow to try to get the money.
- 14. I know of many individuals with the same story that I have told. I want to stop Mr. Me and Union Cab. He has ripped off a lot of people and I want to prevent other people from suffering the same way.

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### DECLARATION OF SALUDDIN SHAIKH

- 1. My name is Saluddin Shaikh. I am over age 18 and I am a citizen of the United States
- 2. I am a taxicab driver with A-card # A-59576. I have been a taxi driver for two and a half years.
- 3. On or about October 2006 I went to Union Cab Company and spoke to the owner, Mr. Me Quong Truong ("Mr. Me"), for purposes of seeing if there were any opportunities to purchase or lease a vehicle from Union Cab, because I had a friend "Assim" who was making money this way. Mr. Me told me he had a long term lease for me.
- Mr. Me told me he had a long term lease for me and that I should pay him then, but that the car would be ready in a couple of weeks. In October 2006 I gave him \$4,000. He promised to give me a Yellow Cab for a long-term lease.
- 5. On November <u>15</u>, 2006 I gave him a credit card to pay for my long-term lease. Mr. Me and I went to Yellow Cab's premises. Pamela Martinez, Yellow Cab's Controller, met with us. She charged \$20,000 to my credit card to pay for my long-term lease.
- 6. Throughout November and December 2006 and January 2007, I was driving various Yellow Cabs for my friend Assim. We always shift-changed these Yellow Cabs on Union Cab's lot. I picked up different cabs every day, and they were assigned to me by Victor Yuen, Union's manager.
- In December 2006 I decided to dispute the charge to my credit card since I still had not received the cab that Mr. Me had promised me.
- 8. On February 1, 2007, Mr. Me, on behalf of Union Cab, signed a fouryear/350,000 miles contract for Medallion # 514. Medallion # 514 is a Yellow Cab vehicle. I tried to use my credit card again to purchase the vehicle but Mr. Me stated that he needed the money that day. I arranged for the money to be ready at the bank and Mr. Me picked it up that evening.
- On April 30, 2007, "Ming," who represented himself to me a manager from Bay Cab, came to me and told me that Medallion # 514 was his vehicle. He said he had bought it three months before from Mr. Me.
- 10. The same day, the medallion holder came and took the vehicle to the Yellow lot. I have not seen it since and have not been able to work with that vehicle, despite
- paying for my long term lease up front.
  11. Throughout the entire time I worked, I drove Yellow Cabs and collected credit card payments. Mr. Me told me I could not deal with Yellow Cab to get the payments and had to submit the receipts to him. I submitted credit card receipts to Mr. Me from November 2006-April 2007. Every ten days I would have approximately \$1,500 in receipts from my Yellow Cab customers. Mr. Me only reimbursed me for my receipts two or three times, and during those times he made only partial payments of \$500-\$1000. These partial payments occurred in January-March 2007. In April I did not receive any payments.

- 1. My name Kamaljit Singh. I am over age 18 and a citizen of the United States. 2. I am a licensed San Francisco taxi driver and my A-card number is P44-051-904.
- 3. I first met Mr. Me Quong Truong ("Mr. Mo") on February 16, 2007. I met him because on February 15, 2007 my friend Ravinda Singh and I met Mohammed Asim Butt, a Yellow Cab driver. He told us Union Cab had leases available. Mr. Me called me on February 15, 2007 and told me to come the next day with \$22,448 on February 16, 2007.
- 4. Mr. Me told me to come to his house in the Sunset District. Ravinda and I went there with \$15,000. The same day, I deposited \$5,000 more into his checking account 3113172352, the account for Union Auto Shop. He gave me a receipt for Yellow Cab # 211 and wrote out several provisions pertaining to this vehicle, including requiring that I would shift-change this Yellow vehicle at the Union
- 5. I asked him when I could pick up the vehicle and he told me on February 19 or 20. I asked him for a pink slip for the vehicle and he said he would provide it when we picked up the cab.
- 6. Ravinda and I went to the Union lot on February 19, 2007 and picked up Yellow Cab # 211. Nate Dwiri was there. Mr. Me asked me for my DMV printout and all that I had was a one-year old printout. I provided it to him and he stated that I could drive with the old printout. I asked for the pink slip for the vehicle and he said he would provide it later.
- 7. Ravinda and I started driving Yellow #211. I drove this vehicle exclusively until approximately March 11, 2007. Then Mr. Me told me that the medallion holder for the vehicle was returning from out of the country and wanted to drive two to three shifts per week. After that, I still drove Yellow # 211 but so did the medallion holder.
- 8. Then on April 17, 2007, the medallion holder repossessed the vehicle. Mr. Me called Yellow Cab and informed them of this and Yellow Cab froze the computer. The medallion holder #211, Ascuncion Florante, then took the vehicle to the Union Cab lot. The medallion holder claimed he had not been paid by Mr. Me and that is why he had repossessed the vehicle. SUBJECT: Revocation of Color Scheme and Dispatch Permits for Union Cab Company, Inc.

PERMIT HOLDER: Me Quong Truong, John Nguyen, and Tu Lam, 1620 Davidson Ave., San Francisco, CA 94124.

Pursuant to the Second Amended Complaint and the noticed hearing which occurred June 12, 2007, the following findings are adopted:

#### FINDINGS:

By a preponderance of the evidence, Union Cab violated the following rules and provisions of the Taxicab/Ramped Taxi Rules and Regulations and the Municipal Police Code:

5.A.1, 5.A.3, 5.A.4, 5.H.2, 5.H.3, 5.H.4, 5.H.6, 5.H.9, 5.H.15, 5.H.16, 5.H.17, 5.I.2, 5.I.3, 5.K.3., 5.C.2, 5.C.3, 5.C.5, 5.E.1.c, and MPC§1140(a), §1123(a), §1135.1(b)(ii), §1147.4, §1148.6(b), and §1187.1.

#### **FINDING 2:**

Because multiple violations were found as to the color scheme permit, the dispatch permit is also revoked under MPC § 1090(b).

#### DECISION:

The Taxicab Commission orders, that Union Cab Company's color scheme and dispatch permits are hereby REVOKED.

#### SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

The San Francisco Taxi Commission and Mr. John Nguyen and Mr. Tu Lam, Color Scheme Permit Holders for Union Cab Company Inc., hereby agree as follows:

- 1. Mr. Nguyen and Mr. Lam will pay the sum of \$10,000 to the City and County of San Francisco. Said payments shall be made by check or money order in the monthly amount of \$277.76 for thirty-six (36) months or three (3) years.
- 2. No interest shall owe on the amount due.
- 3. Mr. Nguyen and Mr. Lam shall be allowed to accelerate these payments and pay off the total before 36 months have elapsed. There will be no penalty for said acceleration.
- 4. Payments shall be due on the 1<sup>st</sup> of every month and shall be deemed late by the 5<sup>th</sup> of every month. The first payment shall begin September 1, 2007 and the last payment shall be due August 1, 2010.
- 5. If Mr. Nguyen and Mr. Lam miss a payment, the case will be placed before the Taxi Commission Hearing Officer or the Taxi Commission with a minimum of fifteen (15) calendar days' notice and shall proceed as if this Settlement Agreement had not been entered into. "Missing a payment" is defined as failure to pay by the 5<sup>th</sup> of the month for the month in which payment is due.
- 6. Payments will be made via mail or in person at the Taxi Commission offices at 25 Van Ness, Suite 420, San Francisco, CA, 94102. Payments shall be made via check or money order with beneficiary "City and County of San Francisco."
- 7. Mr. Nguyen and Mr. Lam are prohibited from operating under the "Union Cab Color Scheme" in the City and County of San Francisco in perpetuity.

### GENERAL AGREEMENT OF AUTHORIZATION

By entering this agreement both John Nguyen permit holder of medallion #806 and Tu Quang Lam permit holder of medallion #896, herein after known as "party one" and Me Quang Truong herein after known as "party two." Party one is recognized by the San Francisco Taxicab Commission as the color scheme permit holder of Union Cab Company and party one and party two are recognized as general partners of Union Cab Dispatch Company.

Party one agrees unconditionally to authorized party two to solely manage and operate as Chief Executive of Union Cab Company and Union Cab Dispatch Company. Whereas Party one is released from civil, financial and all liabilities relating to both Union Cab Company and Union Cab Dispatch Company and both at law and in equity that has or may have against party one and arising from the beginning of time to the date hereof. Whereas as said agreement above, party one grants Me Quang Truong sole manageability and disbursements of the assets, goodwill and equity located at 1620 Davidson Avenue. Upon dissolution of the partnership between party one and part two, ninety nine percent of the assets, equity and goodwill will be granted to party two and one percent will be for party one.

The terms of the agreement set thereto

- 1. Tu Quang Lam and John Nguyen will receive forty percent of the color scheme profit based on each unit after deducting from radio leasing fees.
- 2. By agreement, any medallion color scheme only that is brought in by either Tu Quang Lam or John Nguyen, the net proceeds will be shared evenly between party one and party two.

This agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties.

I received payments from Mr. Tu Lam and Mr. John Nguyen for several months without incident. However, I did receive a notice from the Treasurer's Office that Mr. Lam submitted a check with insufficient funds for the February 2008 payment. Mr. Lam also failed to submit payments for October 2008, November 2008, and December 2008.

4. Attached as Exhibit 1 is a notice from the Treasurer's Office reflecting the insufficient funds notice our office received.

Attached as Exhibit 2 is a spreadsheet I keep to track the payments.

6. I also maintain filings for medallion holders, including the annual Form 1095 filings in which medallion holders indicate their compliance with the rules and regulations governing the

On January 26, 2000, the Taxi Detail conducted an audit of your waybills to determine if you were in compliance with the "full time driver" requirement as specified in Section 1081 (b) of the San Francisco Municipal Police Code. The result of our audit indicates that you have not complied with this regulation. In addition, the waybills that you submitted were found to be incomplete.

Section 1138 of the San Francisco Municipal Police Code requires that drivers of taxicabs keep an accurate and legible waybill which includes the date of operation, starting & ending times, vehicle license#, cab#, medallion#, starting and ending mileage & units, time of hire and discharge of passenger and the locations of fare pickup and drop off.

In addition, Section VI. C. 8. of the San Francisco Taxicab/Ramped Taxi Rules and regulations requires that waybills be completed in indelible ink and signed by the driver at the start of the shift.

This letter is to act as a FORMAL REPRIMAND for violation of the above regulations. You are required to drive at least 4 hours a day for 185 days in a calendar year. Furthermore, <u>only completed waybills</u> will be used in determining the total number of days /shifts worked. In addition, you must drive your own medallion number taxicab when complying with this full time driving requirement as per Section IV A. 10. of the San Francisco Taxicab/Ramped Taxi Rules & Regulations.

This is to act in lieu of any further disciplinary action on this matter.

Violations of any of the codes and/or rules regulating the taxicab industry is punishable by an admonishment, non-traffic infraction, misdemeanor, fine, administrative reprimand, suspension or revocation.

#### To: All Prop K Medallion Holders

On 01/25/00, the Taxi Commission adopted Resolution #2000-05 defining "Business Day" and what constitutes the number of "Business Days" in the calendar year as per the driving requirement specified in Proposition K. The Commission approved the definition of "Business days" as days that are based upon four 10 hour days per week. Furthermore, the Commission set the required number of shifts needed to meet the Proposition K driving requirement as 156 shifts per calendar year.

The Taxicab Detail, when conducting future Prop K audits or when investigating complaints of Prop K violations will enforce this new resolution requiring that Medallion Holders drive at least 4 hours during any 24 hour period for at least 156 shifts per calendar year.

In addition, Medallion Holders must adhere to the below listed rules and regulations concerning waybills.

Section 1138 of the San Francisco Municipal Police Code requires that drivers of taxicabs keep an accurate and legible waybill which includes the date of operation, driver's name, vehicle license#, cab#, medallion#, starting & ending times, starting & ending mileage, starting & ending units, number of passengers, origin and destination of each trip, time of hire and discharge and the fare amount.

Section VI. C. 8. of the San Francisco Taxicab/Ramped Taxi Rules and regulations requires that waybills be completed in indelible ink, signed by the driver at the start of the shift and filed at the Color Scheme's place of business at the conclusion of each shift.

Section IV A. 10. of the San Francisco Taxicab/Ramped Taxi Rules & Regulations requires that unless their taxicab is out of service, all Medallion Holders must drive only their own medallion number taxicab when complying with the "Prop K" full time driving requirement.

Only the original waybills that are both accurate and complete will be counted when measuring the total number of shifts worked per calendar year.

Furthermore, requests for a either a 90 day suspension of the driving requirement or a modification of the driving requirement under the provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act must be made in writing to the Taxi Commission.

This letter is to act as a FORMAL ADMONISHMENT for a violations of :

Sec. 1081 (b) MPC which requires that you engage as a permittee-driver for at least 4 hours during any 24-hour period for at least 75 percent of the business days during the calendar year (156 shifts).

Sec. 6. C. 8. of the San Francisco Taxicab Commission Taxicab/Ramped Taxi Rules and Regulations which requires that waybills are signed by the driver at the start of the shift, completed in indelible ink, include the total # of hours worked and are filed with the Color Scheme at the end of the shift.

Furthermore, in accordance with Sec. 5. H. 14 of the Taxicab Commission Rules & Regulations, this letter is to formally advise you to obtain either company receipts or copies of your waybills turned into the Color Scheme and retain them for a period of three years.

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### DECLARATION OF SCOTT LEON

1. I am over the 18 years old and a citizen of the United States, and I am not a party to this action.

2. I am an Investigator with the San Francisco Taxi Commission. My duties involve investigating Color Schemes and permit holders of the taxicab industry to ensure they meet the regulatory compliance of the Taxicab/Ramped Taxi Rules and Regulations enacted by the Taxi Commission. I conduct audits and inspections, detect violations and fraud in the taxi industry, and I collect, maintain, and analyze evidence for disciplinary cases.

3. I have reviewed the record in the case of Mr. Tu Lam. I have reviewed the driver's schedules for Town Taxi, the color scheme with which Mr. Tu Lam # 896 is affiliated. Town Taxi's schedules show each medallion at the company and each driver working. Mr. Lam does not appear on any of the schedules for Calendar Years 2007 and 2008. Additionally, there are no waybills for Mr. Lam on file at Town Taxi.

4. My investigation leads me to believe that Mr. Lam has failed to meet the Proposition K Driving Requirement for Calendar Year 2007 and Calendar Year 2008.

5. On December 11, 2008, I contacted Monster Cable to obtain employment verification for Mr. Lam. I obtained verbal verification from Monster Cable that he was employed from June 1984 until December 28, 2007. I expect to have written verification before the date of the hearing.

6. I am unable to locate any waybills for Mr. Lam from Calendar Year 2005, nor is there any record he was driving that year. I find it difficult to believe that he was driving, owing to the fact that he was employed at Monster Cable as a supervisor until December 28, 2007, and his tax returns from 2005 show full-time employment at Monster Cable. I believe that Mr. Lam was not driving

during Calendar Year 2005.

### **RE: COLOR SCHEME AUDIT**

On December 11, 2008 the Taxi Commission representative has come to SF Town Taxi to conduct an unannounced Color Scheme Audit. The company was asked to produce among various documents, the file of Mr. Tu Lam, permit holder # 896, including his contract, driving schedule (roster) and the waybills for 2008 calendar year. Mr. Lam is an independent owner/operator. According to his contract, he leases SF Town Taxi colors and uses our radio dispatching services. Town Taxi also provides the drivers of cab # 896 with workers compensation coverage.

No waybills for Mr. Lam were present. His name does not appear on the driving rosters for 2007 and the first half of 2008 calendar years that were submitted by SF Town Taxi on request from Taxi Commission. These rosters to the best of my knowledge are full and complete. The auditor then requested to see and make a copy of all waybills that were belonging to the taxicab vehicle # 896. No physical count of the waybills was done.

SF Town Taxi complied with all requests made by Taxi Commission auditor. No outstanding issues were left upon completion of an audit, to which fact this formal acknowledgment by the SF Town Taxi is issued.
