## COMPLAINT

- 1. Complaint is hereby made against Hakim Ikariouen, P-44 Permit # 86602, that said permit holder has conducted himself in a disorderly manner and violated provisions of the Municipal Police Code and Taxicab/Ramped Taxi Rules and Regulations as described below.
- 2. On January 19, 2008, at 1:20 AM, Mr. Ikariouen was operating Yellow Taxicab # 1186 in the City and County of San Francisco, California. He was waiting at the Nikko Hotel. Ms. Janice came out of the hotel to the taxi line and into Mr. Ikariouen's taxicab vehicle. She wanted to be driven to her home at San Francisco, California. Mr. Ikariouen took the route of Market, to Upper Market, to Taraval and made a right turn on 19th Avenue.
- 3. Mr. Ikariouen drove past Avenue without stopping and Ms became alarmed. She told him he was going the wrong way, and they began to argue about the fare. She told him she wasn't going to pay him. Mr. Ikariouen stopped the taxicab at 19<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Kirkham and ordered her out of the cab. Ms. told Mr. Ikariouen she was going to call the police. She exited the taxicab vehicle and dialed 911. Mr. Ikariouen exited the vehicle and tried to grab the cell phone out of her hands. They struggled for the cell phone and then Mr. Ikariouen put both hands around Ms. s neck and strangled her. He pushed her to the ground and she dropped the cell phone. He picked it up and stated "I'm going to take your phone as payment." He then walked off with the phone and entered the vehicle again. Ms. got off the ground, entered the vehicle, and tried to grab the phone away from him. (See Exhibit A: Declaration of Janice Exhibit B: SFPD Incident Report # 080065557.)

5. Mr. Ikariouen was summarily suspended by the Taxi Detail on April 30, 2008. (Exhibit C: Summary Suspension and Complaint.)

- 6. Ms. suffered physical and psychological injury from the trauma that was inflicted upon her by Mr. Ikariouen. She filed for a restraining order in San Francisco County Superior Court, and the Order was granted on August 20, 2008. (Exhibit D: Restraining Order After Hearing.)
- 7. Municipal Police Code § 1141 provides that "in any case of disagreement between the driver and passenger of a motor vehicle for hire relative to the legal fare to be paid, the driver shall convey the passenger to the nearest police station, where the officer in charge shall immediately decide the case, and if the decisions in favor of the passenger, the driver shall convey the passenger from the police station to his original destination without additional charge; if the passenger is about to leave the City by railroad, steamboat or otherwise, the police officer on duty at the depot or wharf shall decide the case."
- 8. California Penal Code § 243(d) states "battery is any willful and unlawful use of force or violence upon the person or another...(d) when a battery is committed against any person and serious bodily injury in inflicted on the person, the battery is punishable by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding one year or imprisonment in the state prison for two, three, or four years."
- 9. California Penal Code § 591.5 states "a person who, unlawfully and maliciously removes, injuries, destroys, or damages any wireless communication device with the intent to prevent the use of the device to summon assistance or notify law enforcement or any public safety agency of a crime is guilty of a misdeameanor."

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10. California Penal Code § 211 states "robbery is the felonious taking of personal property in the possession of another, from his person or immediate presence, and against his will, accomplished by means of force or fear."

- 11. Rule 6.D.1 provides that "no taxicab driver shall speak in an obscene, boisterous, loud, threatening, or abusive manner while in the course of their employment as a taxicab driver."
- Rule 6.D.2 provides that "no taxicab driver shall threaten, harass, or abuse any other person 12. while in the course of their employment as a taxicab driver,"
- 13. Rule 6.D.3 provides that "no taxicab driver shall attempt to use any physical force against any person except in self-defense or in defense of another."
- 14. Section 6 of the Taxicab/Ramped Taxi Rules and Regulations of the Taxi Commission is devoted to Drivers. Rule 6.A.1 provides that drivers shall "comply with the provisions of the Charter, Police Code, Planning Code, and Traffic Code of the City and County of San Francisco, the California Vehicle Code, California's Worker's Compensation Laws and these Taxicab Regulations." Mr. Ikariouen violated several rules and several provisions of the Municipal Police Code and the Penal Code, including MPC § 1141, CPC §§ 211, 243(d), and 591.5, and Rules 6.D.1, 6.D.2, 6.D.3. Additionally, San Francisco County Superior Court issued a restraining order against him. Mr. Ikarouien's P-44 permit should be REVOKED and he should be prohibited from driving a taxicab vehicle in San Francisco for a minimum of ten years, if not longer.
- A hearing will be scheduled for 11:30 AM on October 3, 2008 in Room 408 of City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett, San Francisco, CA, 94102. The Commission will present Sgt. Ron Reynolds and Janice as witnesses.

EXHIBIT A

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I am over the age of 18 and I am a citizen of the United States,

2. My name is Janice, and I decline to state my address, but I am a resident of California.

On or about January 19, 2008, I decided to meet a friend who was staying at a hotel downtown. After meeting with my friend at the hotel, I left the hotel around 1:00 AM by myself and I took a Yellow Cab # 1186 that was waiting in front of the hotel. Before I got into the taxicab, I asked if the driver would take me to and he confirmed that he would. I got into the cab and he proceeded to go to my former home address of San Francisco, CA. It was late and I was tired so I leaned my head up against the right rear passenger side of the car. The driver, a Middle Eastern male who was under 6', with dark hair, and who spoke with an accent, took a route towards the Twin Peaks /St. Francis Woods area to take me home.

As we approached my neighborhood, I realized my surroundings were different and stated, in essence, "excuse me sir, you just passed my apartment, I live back there", but the driver kept going and told me, in essence, "NO! YOU LIVE THIS WAY!!" in a very stern voice as he went in the same direction heading northbound on 19th Avenue, I stated again, in essence, "I don't live this way, I live back at a and he exclaimed, in essence, "NO! YOU LIVE THIS WAY!!" and I replied, in essence, "if you're not going to take me home, I am not going to pay you for going the wrong way". It got really quiet and the driver made a right turn at Judah Street, so I thought he was going to turn around and take me home, but the driver made another right turn on 18th Avenue and started to drive really slow, and then he took another right on Kirkham Street and by this time he was driving really slow in a very dark area. The driver was very angry and irate at this point. He stated, in essence, "You're going to pay me!" and I told him I wasn't going to pay him for going the wrong direction and especially if he wasn't going to take me back to my apartment. At the corner of 18th Avenue and Kirkham Street he slammed on the brakes and stated, in essence, "get the fuck out of the cab bitch!" I told him that it wasn't right and I was going to call the police because I was afraid and fearful at that point due to his anger. I took my cellular phone out of my purse to

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started dialing 911 for the police, but they did not answer. I became fearful and exited the taxicab vehicle. At that point I was in total fear and I didn't know if my call to 911 had gone through or not since they didn't answer and a recording was playing.

The driver put the cab into park, got out of the cab, and came after me. He came right up in front of me and tried to grab the phone to prevent me from calling 911 and he was screaming at me to give him his money. While he was attempting to take my cell phone, he was also trying to take my purse for payment. When he couldn't get the phone or my purse, he put both of his hands around my neck and throat and started choking and strangling me. I was trying desperately to get away at that point. Using his hands against my neck, he threw me to the ground, and I hit the concrete sidewalk. I landed on my left elbow, and in the process of the fall I let go of my cell phone and purse. He picked up the cell phone since it was closest to him and said "I'm going to take your phone as my payment."

He picked up the cell phone and ran back to the taxicab. He got inside and prepared to leave. I didn't want to leave my cell phone because it has personal identifying information of myself, family, friends and professional business contacts, so I got up from the ground and opened the front passenger door of the taxicab vehicle. I struggled with him to get my phone back, which was in his hands and I eventually was able to grab it and as I started to get away from him he got back out of the taxicab and came after me again and attacked me again. I was screaming for help and was able to get away so I ran away down the street away from the cab. I was crying and screaming for help at that point. I didn't see which way he drove away since I was trying to get away from him.

I called 911 after the attacks as I was trying to get away and spoke with an operator. Then my phone wouldn't work. As I was running towards 19th Avenue, a man came up to assist me and he dialed 911. The police came and I made a report of what had happened. I was hyperventilating from fear and panic and it was hard to give the report.

I went home and spent the entire next two days, Sunday and Monday, which was a holiday, in bed because I was suffering from pain and emotional trauma due to what had happened. On Tuesday I went to Kaiser and saw a doctor. I was spitting up a small amount of blood, had neck, back and arm pain and sought additional treatment for that. Additionally, I had

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bruises on my neck, throat and elbow from when he choked and strangled me and threw me to the ground. I was diagnosed with cervical, thoracic, lumbosacral, and elbow/forearm sprains/strains and post traumatic stress syndrome.

Since the driver knew my address, I was concerned he might try to come back. I am very terrified of him because of the events of that evening. For those reasons, I moved out of my apartment in San Francisco to stay with a friend in another city.

It was only later I learned that when I had tried to call 911 initially, and thought that it had 10. not dialed and reached the operator, in fact it had gone through. I have reviewed the recordings from 911, and it is an accurate recording of the events that occurred that night. I also reviewed a recording of the second call made by the male who assisted me that night, and that is also an accurate recording. The tape recording is enclosed.

On August 20, 2008, I obtained a restraining order against the driver, who I know to be 11. Hakimi Ikariouen, in San Francisco Superior Court. Mr. Ikariouen came to the hearing unaccompanied by anyone and gave a description of the events that was not accurate whatsoever.

I have a lot of fear about riding in taxicabs and I have great fear my attacker is going to come after me again and come to my place of work, residence or follow me and attack me again after this incident. I have suffered greatly as a result of this attack and I don't believe this driver should ever have a chance to do this to another passenger in his vehicle.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the 13. foregoing is true and correct.

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

At the address of 1200 Mississippi St., San Francisco, in the said City & County, that the said business was conducted by Hakin Ikariouen in an unlawful, disorderly and improper manner as follows, to wit:

On 01/19/2008, at 0120 hrs, Mr. Ikariouen was operating Yellow Taxicab# 1186 in the City and County of San Francisco, California. Mr. Ikariouen picked up Janice at the Nikko Hotel. had been drinking with friends at the hotel and was going home alone. wanted to be driven to her home at the hotel and was going. Ikariouen started driving to Market, to Upper Market to Taraval and made a right turn on 19th Ave. Ikariouen drove past and continued north bound on 19th Ave. became alarmed and told Ikariouen that he was going the wrong way. They started to argue. ( told Ikariouen she wasn't going pay him. Ikariouen abruptly stopped the taxicab at 19th Ave and Kirkham and ordered out of the taxicab. told Ikariouen she was going to "call the cops". She exited the taxicab and dialed 911. Ikariouen exited the taxi and tried to grab cell phone. They struggled for the cell phone and then Ikariouen put both of his hands around neck and strangled her. He then pushed her to the ground and she lost control of her cell phone. Ikariouen let go of s neck and picked up the cell phone. Ikariouen then stated, "I'm going to take your phone as payment". Ikariouen then walked off with so cell phone and sat in his taxicab. ( got off the ground and enter the taxicab to try and recover her personal property. She grabbed her cell phone from Ikariouen's hands and started screaming. Ikariouen let go of the cell phone and experiment exists the taxicab. People started coming to the said and Ikariouen left the area. Police were called by a stranger and the police arrived and prepared a police report. This case is currently being reviewed by the San Francisco District Attorneys Office for a criminal complaint against Ikariouen.

Municipal Police Code 1141 states:

In any case of disagreement between the driver and passenger of a motor vehicle for hire relative to the legal fare to be paid, the driver shall convey the passenger to the nearest police station, where the officer in charge shall immediately decide the case, and if the decisions in favor of the passenger, the driver shall convey the passenger from the police station to his original destination without additional charge; if the passenger is about to leave the City by railroad, steamboat or otherwise, the police officer on duty at the depot or wharf shall decide the case.

Municipal Police Code 1090(a) (vii) states:

(a) Revocation for Cause. Any permit issued under this article may be suspended or revoked by the Police Commission for good cause after a noticed hearing. "Good cause" hereunder shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following:

(viii) The permit tee violated the Traffic Code of the City and County of San Francisco or the Vehicle Code or related laws of the State of California.

Municipal Police Code 1090(c) states:

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(c) Suspension by the Chief of Police. The Chief of Police may suspend summarily any permit issued under this Article pending a disciplinary hearing before the Police Commission when in the opinion of said Chief of Police the public health or safety requires such summary suspension, Any affected permit tee shall be given notice of such summary suspension in writing delivered to said permit tee in person or by registered letter.

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Galifornia Penal Code section 243(d) states:

Battery is any willful and unlawful use of force or violence upon the person of another.

(d) When a battery is committed against any person and serious bodily injury in inflicted on the person, the battery is punishable by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding one year or imprisonment in the state prison for two, three, or four years.

California Penal Code 591.5 states:

A person, who unlawfully and maliciously removes, injuries, destroys, or damages any wireless communication device with the intent to prevent the use of the device to summon assistance or notify law enforcement or any public safety agency of a crime is guilty of a misdemeanor.

California Penal Code 211 states:

Robbery is the felonious taking of personal property in the possession of another, from his person or immediate presence, and against his will, accomplished my means of force or fear.

Taxicah/Rumped Taxi Rules and Regulations 6.A. 1. states:

Every licensed permit holder shall comply with the provisions of the Charter, Police Code, Planning Code and Traffic Code of the City and County of San Francisco. The California Vehicle Code, California Worker's Compensation Laws and these Taxicab Regulations. The provisions of all ordinances and regulations applicable to the San Francisco International Airport, San Francisco City and County Department of Agriculture and Weights and Measures and all other governmental jurisdictions thought which the permit holders traverse.

The SFPD Taxi Detail believes that Mr. Ikariouen demonstrated irresponsible assaultive criminal behavior and poor judgment regarding his handling of a fare dispute in San Francisco. He resorted to violence and theft to resolve the dispute. He physically and emotionally injured a young female that will probably never take a taxicab ride again. The District Attorney is currently reviewing this case to see if criminal changes can be filed against Ilkariouen. Therefore, the Taxi Detail requested that the Taxi Commission start administrative disciplinary proceedings against Hakin Ikariouen for being a danger to the public safety, criminal behavior, assault, theft and for not being in compliance with the Taxicab/Ramped Taxi Rules and Regulations, the San Francisco Municipal Police Code and the California Vehicle Code.
